This informative workshop will introduce components of in-service pedestrian safety reviews and identify potential issues and opportunities to improve pedestrian safety in a multimodal transportation system.

The agenda is structured to allow attendees the opportunity to discuss pedestrian safety issues and countermeasures with various stakeholder representatives within the workshop and during the field component at a nearby intersection. Improvements in pedestrian safety will be reviewed with explicit consideration of potential interaction and safety impacts associated with other users of the transportation system. The workshop will convene at the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center and then move to a nearby intersection at Commerce Street and Losoya Street.

Session moderators/presenters will include individuals from the ITE Transportation Safety Council, City of San Antonio transportation engineering department, VIA Metropolitan Transit, Accessibility Committee, San Antonio Police Department and AARP. Participants will receive copies of the *Pedestrian Safety and Mobility Audit Guide* prepared for AARP by ITE.
