

## **DANIEL B. FAMBRO STUDENT PAPER AWARD**

**DEADLINE: April 1\***

**\*\**For Southern District (District 5) ONLY: deadline for the applications is March 1.***

The Daniel B. Fambro Student Paper Award may be awarded annually for a significant paper prepared by a student member of the Institute. The award is named after Daniel B. Fambro, professor at Texas A&M University and Associate Research Engineer at the Texas Transportation Institute. Daniel Fambro died in September 1999 at the age of 48. In naming the award in Dan's honor, ITE recognizes his exemplary service to ITE and his dedication to his students and the profession.

The purpose of the Daniel B. Fambro Student Paper Award is to encourage student members of the Institute of Transportation Engineers to conduct and report on independent and original research and investigation of transportation engineering subjects and to provide a means for recognizing outstanding accomplishment in this area. All student members of ITE are invited to submit a written paper on a transportation engineering issue for consideration in the 2011 ITE Daniel B. Fambro Student Paper Award Competition.

### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- To be an eligible recipient for the proposed award, a candidate must have been a student member of the Institute between April 1 of the prior year and March 31 of the current year.
- The candidate must have completed work providing a basis for the paper while a student member of the Institute.

### **SUBMITTAL PROCEDURE:**

- The District Award Coordinator (see next page) must receive an electronic copy of the original student paper **on or before April 1**. Submittals received after April 1 will not be considered.
- All materials must be submitted electronically (formatted in Adobe Acrobat®) on or before the published deadline.
- Papers must be sent directly to the Award Coordinator for your District. **DO NOT** send papers to ITE first, as this will delay the timely judging of your application.

### **PAPER TOPIC & FORMAT**

- Papers must address a transportation engineering subject.
- Papers must have only one student author; advisors can be listed.
- Application must be submitted in English.
- Paper must be typewritten, double-spaced, on standard 8 ½" x 11" white paper.
- Maximum length of paper is 5,000 words.
- Paper must include a table of contents and title page showing title of the paper, the author's name and address, the ITE District Name, and the mailing address and phone number where the author can be contacted between June 1 and July 1, 2011.

### **EVALUATION CRITERIA:**

- Originality – 20%
- Significance – 20
- Scope and format – 20 %
- Validity – 20 %
- Applicability – 20 %

### **AWARD:**

- Recognition at the ITE Annual Meeting and in *ITE Journal*
- Inscribed plaque
- Up to \$1,750 travel reimbursement to attend ITE Annual Meeting (at which the award will be presented)
- Possibility of paper being published in *ITE Journal*
