INTRODUCTION

Transportation plays a vital role in the economies of all countries. Yet transportation professionals are currently in short supply. As part of its program to attract bright and articulate individuals to the transportation engineering profession, the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) has established several fellowship and scholarship awards for graduate study in the field of transportation. These fellowships will provide financial aid for qualified students to pursue graduate degrees in transportation in a variety of programs.

The awards bestow international recognition upon the recipients and increase the public's awareness of the role and responsibilities of the transportation engineer.

- Unless otherwise noted, all award applications are to be submitted no later than 5:00pm EST on April 1, 2009. *Applications received after this date will not be considered.*
- All award applications are to be submitted electronically and formatted in Adobe Acrobat to the contact noted in each announcement. Failure to follow these guidelines will cause the award not to be judged.
- Applications for any award should be prepared based upon stated eligibility criteria that have been established for the awards.
- All award submissions become the property of ITE.
- Award winners will be notified after June 1st.

All student members of the Institute of Transportation Engineers are invited to submit a written paper on a transportation engineering issue for consideration in the 2009 ITE Daniel B. Fambro Student Paper Award Competition.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be a dues-paid student member of ITE during the period between April 1, 2008 and March 31, 2009.
- Applicant must have completed the work that provides the basis for the paper while a student member of ITE.
- Applicant must be the only author - **no student co-authors**. Faculty advisor co-authors are acceptable.

SUBMITTAL

- The District Award Coordinator must receive an **electronic copy**, (formatted in Adobe Acrobat), of the paper by April 1, 2009. *If the entry is received after this date it will not be considered.*
- Please send papers directly to the Award Coordinator for your District, do NOT send papers to ITE first, as this will delay the timely judging of your application.

PAPER TOPIC & FORMAT

- Applications must be submitted in English.
- Papers must address a transportation engineering subject.
- Maximum length is 15 pages. The page limit also includes title page, table of contents and any attachments - these pages must be equal to or less than 15.
- Title page must include the title of the paper, the author's name, the ITE District Number and the mailing address where the author can be contacted between June 1 and July 1, 2009.

- The Annual Report forms may still be used as part of the award submittal, as long as the entire document does not exceed 15 pages.
- The Student Chapter Award is based on a year extending from April 1, 2008 to March 31, 2009.

FELLOWSHIPS FOR GRADUATE STUDY IN TRANSPORTATION

Deadline: APRIL 1, 2009**

BURTON M. MARSH AWARD

***For Southern District (District 5) ONLY: deadline for Marsh Award is March 1, 2009*

Burt Marsh was an innovative, courageous leader, an enterprising champion of high-quality traffic engineering and an uncompromising advocate of accurate and sensible methods of traffic education and research. His vision enabled him to see, and in large part effectively answer, the challenge of bringing order and safety to street and highway traffic.

Marsh joined the profession in its infancy, in 1921. In 1924, he became the first full-time city traffic engineer in the United States. In 1933, he was named director of traffic engineering and safety for the American Automobile Association, where he worked until his retirement in 1964. That retirement was short-lived: in 1967 until 1970, he served as executive director of ITE.

Marsh was one of the 18 founding members of ITE, and he served as its second president. In 1955, he was accorded the status of Honorary Member. Five years later, he received ITE's Theodore M. Matson Award. A decade later, ITE established the Burton W. Marsh Award for Distinguished Service and named him the first recipient. In 1988, on the occasion of his 90th birthday, ITE honored him as "Mr. ITE," the man who was "instrumental in the formation and development of the art and science of transportation engineering, from its infancy to its emergence as a true profession."

Marsh died in February 1988. In 1989, in recognition of his life-long commitment to the profession, ITE established the Burton W. Marsh Fellowship for Graduate Study in Traffic and Transportation Engineering. One or more of these fellowships, in the amount of \$4,000 each, will be awarded annually.

HAROLD F. HAMMOND SCHOLARSHIP

In recognition of Harold F. Hammond, ITE has established a scholarship made possible by a generous contribution from Eugene A. Barton. The \$3,000 scholarship will be awarded annually based on need to a student wishing to pursue graduate study in transportation engineering.

WESTERN DISTRICT FELLOWSHIP

The Western District Fellowship consists of a \$1,000 annual award given to the highest-ranked candidate who is a resident of District 6 (which is comprised of Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming and all U.S. territories except Puerto Rico). In addition, the candidates must be planning to pursue graduate study at one of the universities within the district.

TEXAS DISTRICT FELLOWSHIPS

Up to two fellowships of \$1,000 each may be awarded annually to the two highest ranked candidates from Texas (District 9). In addition, the course of study must be pursued at one of the universities within the district.

ITE TRANSIT COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP

The ITE Transit Council has established a \$1,000 scholarship to be awarded to the highest-ranking student pursuing a graduate degree in a study program emphasizing public transportation planning, administration,

or engineering, to be described in the student's proposed list of courses and essay.

TRANSOFT SOLUTIONS INC. AHEAD OF THE CURVE SCHOLARSHIP

Transoft Solutions Inc. of Canada recognizes the growing need for investment in future innovators studying within the transportation and/or traffic engineering field. The \$2,000 award will be awarded annually to any student in the United States or Canada wishing to pursue studies in transportation and/or traffic engineering.

ELIGIBILITY

- For the Marsh, Western, Texas Fellowships and the Hammond Scholarship, candidates must be planning to pursue a Master's degree in transportation engineering, with principal course work in traffic engineering, geometric design and/or transportation planning. Doctoral students are not eligible to apply for the above named fellowships and scholarships.
- For the ITE Transit Council Scholarship, candidates must be planning to pursue a graduate degree (Master's only) in a study program emphasizing public transportation planning, administration, or engineering.
- For the Transoft Solutions Scholarship, any transportation engineering student within the United States and Canada may apply. This scholarship is only open to undergraduate, graduate and doctoral students.
- Candidates for the Marsh, Western, Texas Fellowships and the Hammond and ITE Transit Council Scholarships must have earned, or will have earned by December 2009, a Bachelor's degree. Candidates must also be qualified for unconditional admission to the graduate study program at the chosen host university. You must be eligible to begin graduate study in transportation on a full-time basis by January 2010 and not enrolled in such a program as of January 2, 2009.
- If a candidate has previously received one of these fellowships or scholarships, they are not eligible to reapply. Candidates will be considered for any of the above fellowships/scholarships whose requirements they meet.
- One application serves for all of the above fellowships and scholarships. Check the boxes on the application of any fellowship/scholarship whose requirements you meet.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Candidates for the Marsh, Western, Texas Fellowships and the Hammond and Transit Council Scholarships will be evaluated on the basis of their past academic performance, their proposed program of study, an essay discussing their reasons for pursuing a graduate degree in transportation and outlining their career objectives, as well as recommendations from three references. In addition, the recipient must enter full-time graduate study in transportation within 12 months of the closing date of the applications (*Please note: candidates for the Harold F. Hammond Scholarship will also be evaluated on the basis of need).
- Candidates for the Transoft Solutions Scholarship only will be evaluated on the basis of their current academic performance, their proposed program of study, an essay outlining their career objectives and recommendations from three references.

APPLICATION

- To apply for the above fellowships/scholarships, complete the attached application form and return to ITE Headquarters by **5:00 p.m. EST on April 1, 2009**. All accompanying materials

(references and transcripts) must also be received at ITE by this date. Applications and materials not received by this date will not be considered by the selection panel.

- The awards are each for one academic year and are not renewable. Recipients are not eligible to reapply.

- Applications for the awards listed above must include:
 - A completed Fellowships For Graduate Study in Transportation Application Form.
 - An essay, written by the candidate, explaining their reasons for pursuing a graduate degree in transportation as well as outlining career objectives. (Undergraduates applying for the Transoft Solutions Scholarship should explain their future objectives in transportation) The essay should be no longer than two (2) single-spaced, typewritten pages.
 - A copy of the candidate's resume, indicating academic and professional experience, awards, etc.
 - A list of proposed courses for each prospective university/college listed on the application form.
 - Three completed reference forms from the references named on the application form.
 - An official transcript from each university/college the candidate has attended or is currently attending.
 - If the candidate is applying for the Harold F. Hammond Scholarship, they must include a Free Application for Federal Student Aid, which can be ordered by calling 1-800-433-3243.
