ITE Named to 2009 Associations Advance America Honor Roll

WASHINGTON, DC, USA— ITE has been named to the 2009 Associations Advance Honor Roll, a national awards competition sponsored by the American Society of Association Executives (ASAE) and the Center for Association Leadership.

ITE received the award for the National Traffic Signal Operation Self-Assessment and Report Card. The report card shows how local jurisdictions such as cities, counties and states can reap large rewards, such as mitigating congestion and lessening fuel consumption, by making small changes in the way they manage and operate their traffic signal systems. The report also highlights several jurisdictions that have been successful in making changes since the 2005 report card was released. The results contained in the report card are based on the 2007 Traffic Signal Operation Self Assessment released by NTOC in the fall of 2006. A total of 417 agencies responded, representing 47 states.

Now in its 19th year, the prestigious Associations Advance America (AAA) Awards program recognizes associations that propel America forward—with innovative projects in education, skill training, standards setting, business and social innovation, knowledge creation, citizenship and community service. Although association activities have a powerful impact on everyday life, they often go unnoticed by the general public.
