Having served at the Section, District, and International levels of ITE, Bruce served as the president of ITE Canada in 2008-2009, and was elected International President in 2019. He presided over the ITE Annual Meeting in Austin, TX, USA. Bruce is only the fourth International president elected from Canada in ITE's over 90-year history

He is proud of the contributions on various Committees including the inaugural *Leadership*ITE Committee, Legacy Fund Committee and, most recently, the Transportation Planning

Advisory Group whose mission is to help ITE bring more transportation planning professionals into the fold. Bruce is currently leading the development of the Future Leaders Fund for ITE Canada, which is being established to provide financial support for students and young professionals. In 2020, Bruce was honoured with the H. Robert Burton Distinguished Service Award by ITE Canada for his achievements in transportation. The award is ITE Canada's CITE's highest honor.

Bruce has served as an adjunct professor for six years at the University of Regina teaching Engineering Law and Professionalism. Bruce is fixated with cycling as a transportation mode and can often be seen cycling to and from work. Several years ago, he started the August Commuter Cycling Challenge with his transportation team at work.
