As part of the ONE ITE effort to strategically and comprehensively review ITE's structure and operations and following Board procedures that call for review of District boundaries every three years, the Board undertook such a review in 2018. As reported to membership in 2018, the decision to create a new District and modify boundaries were reported, including the intent to create a Rocky Mountain District.

In October, the Board directed a Sub Task Force to study the issues and questions associated with a new Rocky Mountain District. This group includes elected leadership, supporters, and legacy ITE members of Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming.

The group has met 3 times via webinar to provide background and an orientation to participants, discuss opportunities, and review questions/constraints/barriers prior to an in-person workshop to be held in Denver in February. In Denver, the Sub Task Force will work together to develop answers to questions, build guiding principles for the new District, and develop a transition action plan.

The elected Section and Chapter officers will be discussing this work with their members and the findings from the Sub Task Force will be delivered to the Board for their consideration in May. We will continue to communicate about the progress of all of the ONE ITE initiatives in *ITE Journal*, through *Spotlite*, and in *ITE Community*.
